Luigi (Lui) Basile. Director - Governance & Grants

Lui migrated to Australia from Italy with his parents at three years of age in 1949. In 1969 he married Marie and they have four children and four grandsons. In the same year, Lui qualified as a Barrister and Solicitor. He was employed by a local firm in Swan Hill, until he set up his own sole practice in Kerang in 1974, later opening branches at Cohuna and Swan Hill. Lui retired in 2016 after some 53 years involvement in the legal profession, moving to Bendigo in April 2017.

In 1978, Lui was awarded a knighthood by the Italian Government for his services to the Italian community in Swan Hill and district in his capacity as correspondent/agent to the Italian Consulate in Melbourne.

Lui was a Councillor of the Borough of Kerang between 1974-1985, including 2 years as Mayor, a councillor of the Shire of Gannawarra between 2003-2012, including three years as Mayor. He was a member of the Board of the Murray Darling Association between 2004 and 2012, including terms as Treasurer and national Vice President. He also served as a director of Lower Murray Water authority for 6 years.

He was a member of the Kerang Bowls Club between 1973 and 2017, and served terms on the Board as treasurer, and chairperson. He was instrumental in the Club obtaining a Licence to operate Electronic Gaming Machines. He even won his fair share of club events, including A Grade Champion, and was a member of many winning pennant teams Lui was welcomed to the WHBC and now enjoys bowling, and contributing to the activities of the Club.



Allan Charlton, Club President

Allan was born into a Fish Creek, South Gippsland dairy farming family in 1953 and inherited his father's sporting genes. Sport, school then farming were his priorities.

He attended the Foster Primary and Secondary schools, and upon leaving school, worked with the ANZ bank for 10 years at Fish Creek, Foster and Melbourne. During the last five years, he married Fiona and together had three children and now have seven grandchildren. While in the Fish Creek area he played cricket, football and basketball representing all in representative teams. Probably cricket was his pick, playing Country Week in Melbourne in the Premier division. After the bank, the family moved to Foster to manage a motel for two years before moving to Rutherglen where they managed the Red-Carpet Inn motel. They built a restaurant next to the motel and ran that for three years. Together with a mate, Allan started the Rutherglen Basketball Association where he became an A grade umpire, umpiring at state championships. His Life Membership of that association is much appreciated.

As a young family didn't suit the restaurant lifestyle, Allan joined a pig producing company called Bunge Meats, spending the next 33 years with them, although the business name changed a number of times. He started at their site in Corowa, then moved to Moulmein for three years (where he became the Football President), then to Trafalgar for another three years and finally to Bendigo as the site Manager for the last fifteen years before retirement. Apart from management, being involved in company social clubs gave me great pleasure.

And so, at each destination, sport was his total interest especially as his father's administration genes really kicked in. His main ambition at every chance was to try and make a difference. To quote Allan, *“Teamwork and respect ring loudly in my conscience, if that's not your cup of tea – stay away.”*

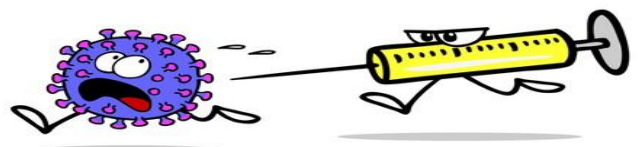
