

Club member Profile: Mary Shawyer

I was born in Ballarat, was the 3rd child in my family. I have 2 older brothers and 1 younger sister. We lived in Horsham at the time, my parents were dairy farmers. We



moved to Yarra Glen where I started school at Lilydale Collage. I finished school in year 9, again we moved to Swan Hill to another dairy farm and started in the work force at a clothing store in Swan Hill. I married in 1974 and we moved to Bendigo where we started our family, we had 4 children, 3 girls and 1 boy.

We built a house in California Gully when the kids started school at St Liborius, we then built a house out at Maiden Gully. As the Children got heavily involved in sport, I decide to start coaching Basketball, which ended up being a big part of our life, coaching several Bendigo squads with success, also was involved in state coaching as well. I returned to work as the children started school working in different hospitality areas cooking etc. I ended up working at the Bendigo stadium for 20 years running the

canteen, where we did lots of big catering functions. From there I started to slow down and worked at Victory College running the canteen for 3 years. That was when I started bowling at White Hills.

I I still have a lot to learn re bowls but I am loving it, the best part is the community connection, feeling part of a club and getting involved is just so important.
